What is Phase-II wind mapping in Pakistan?

Phase-II consisting of Wind Mapping of Northern Areas of Pakistan is own going since July 2005. The demand for energy has increased in tremendous proportions in the last few decades in Pakistan; the same is expected to increase further in the coming years.

What are the capacity factors of wind energy in Pakistan?

Capacity factors may theoretically vary from 0 to 100 per cent, but in practice they will usually range from 20 to 70 per cent, and mostly be around 25-30 per cent.
