Is Peru exempt from tariffs on solar panels

As of the latest available information, the United States does not currently impose any specific import tariffs on goods imported from Peru under a free trade agreement. Peru is a beneficiary country under the U.S.-Peru Trade Promotion Agreement (PTPA), which provides for preferential tariff.

The US Commerce Department set final countervailing and anti-dumping duty rates on Monday for crystalline solar cells and modules imported from four southeast Asian countries. Cells and modules from Vietnam, Malaysia, Thailand and Cambodia are affected. Importers have already been posting cash.

As a result of the PTPA, U.S. consumer and industrial goods exports to Peru are no longer subject to tariffs. Peru eliminated tariffs on almost 90% of U.S. agricultural products thus far. The remaining tariffs will be phased out by 2026. Most imports (93% of codes) are also subject to an 18%.

On January 23, 2018, USTR announced that the President had approved recommendations to provide relief to U.S. manufacturers and impose safeguard tariffs on imported solar cells and modules, based on the investigations, findings, and recommendations of the independent, bipartisan U.S. International.
