What is happening in Slovenia's energy transition?

People and communities in Slovenia's energy transition is emerging strongly. The government and local energy companies are increasingly engaging with communities through consultative processes and collaborative projects that not only address the energy needs but also.

What are the major developments in the renewables sector in Slovenia?

The main developments in the renewables sector include the introduction of the National Energy and Climate Plan and the adoption of secondary legislation, aiming to make Slovenia a climate-neutral society in the coming decades and motivating private finance to invest in projects including renewable sources.

How has Slovenia's energy sector changed over the years?

Will Slovenia's only coal power plant close in 2033?

The Fit-for-55 goal of a 55% drop in emissions is for 2030. Slovenia aims to achieve it only by 2033, the deadline it set for quitting the use of coal. But chances are that the country's only coal power plant, Termoelektrarna Šoštanj (TEŠ), and its accompanying mine Premogovnik Velenje, will close within a few years or operate at minimum capacity.

Does Slovenia have a resilient energy framework?

Enhancing energy security, equity, and sustainability amidst global challenges. This achievement highlights Slovenia's resilient energy framework and strategic advancements in the face of geopolitical tensions, notably the

impacts stemming from conflicts like t.

Is Slovenia's electricity sector fully vertically integrated?

Despite the whole electricity sector being arguably fully vertically integrated in Slovenia due to the level of state ownership, 1.4.1 there is potential for privatisation and/or further market liberalisation, even with the entry of two new suppliers into the market.
