Overview

How does Jamaica's energy system work?

Jamaica's energy system is highly dependent on imported fossil fuels, petroleum imports account for over 80 percent of electricity production. This oil import dependency comes at a high cost. How can battery energy storage help Jamaica?

Battery energy storage systems (BESS) are now emerging as a cornerstone technology to address these challenges—helping Jamaica stabilize its grid, unlock more renewable energy, and reduce electricity costs for both consumers and businesses. The country's electricity cost can reach as high as \$0.32 per kilowatt-hour, far above global averages.

What is the primary source of energy in Jamaica?

The primary source of energy in Jamaica is imported oil. The Jamaican economy is characterized by high energy intensity and low efficiency and is almost completely dependent on it. Petroleum consumption is concentrated in three areas, namely: bauxite/alumina, power generation and transport.

Does Jamaica have a power grid?

The grid currently provides electricity access to approximately 97% of Jamaican households. Jamaica Energy Partners (JEP) Jamaica Energy Partners is an Independent Power Provider that began commercial operations in October 1995, through its ownership of the Doctor Bird Power Plant.

How is Jamaica's energy future being secured?

Jamaica's energy future is being secured through Goal 7: Jamaica's industry structures embracing eco-efficiency for advancing international competitiveness, and moving towards building a green economy.

Who buys electricity in Jamaica?

JPS also purchases additional electricity close to 297 MW from Independent Power Producers (IPPs) such as Jamaica Energy Partners (JEP), Jamaica Private Power Company (JPPC), Jamalco, and Wigton Wind Farm. The grid currently provides electricity access to approximately 97% of Jamaican households.
