WASHINGTON, JUNE 6, 2024 - The World Bank's Board of Executive Directors approved a \$35 million grant to enable solar power generation and increase access to electricity in Guinea-Bissau. The Guinea-Bissau Solar Energy Scale-up and Access Project will work on the development of solar energy.

A large photovoltaic plant has been built in Guinea-Bissau by the European Union in collaboration with TESE, a Portuguese NGO. The facility is set to begin supplying electricity to Bolama Island as soon as it receives government authorisation, reports Lusa. The 550-watt photovoltaic plant cost.
