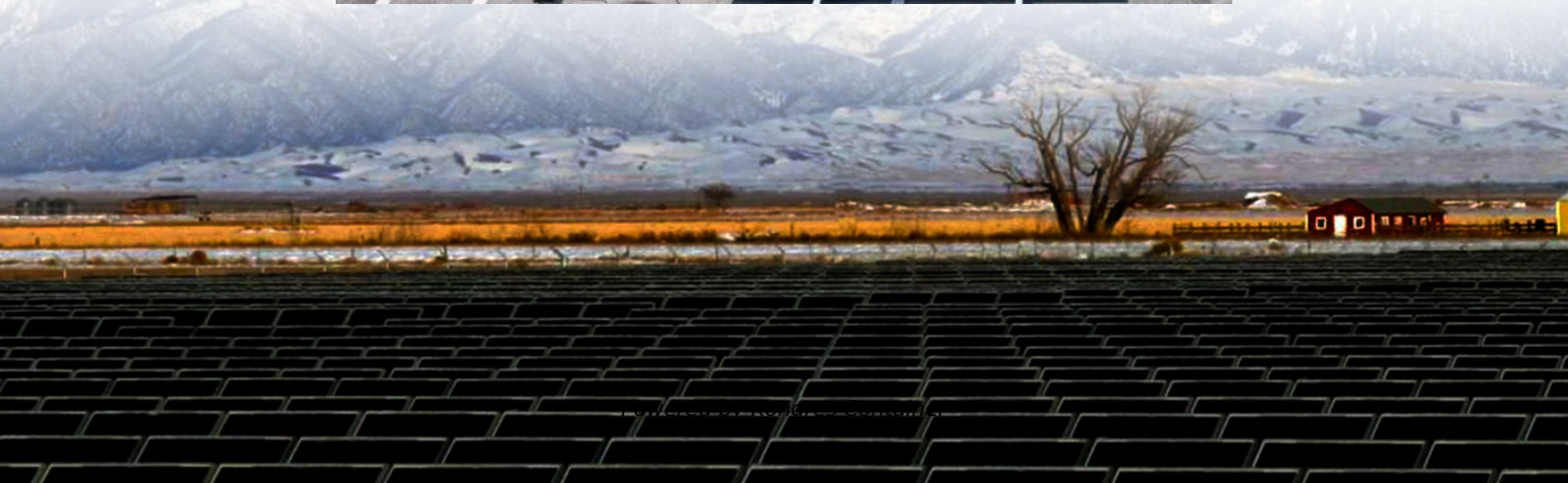

Who controls the media in South Sudan?

In South Sudan, media are heavily controlled by government authorities. The public broadcaster, South Sudan Broadcasting Corporation (SSBC), operates a chain of FM radio stations and a television, which have been used by the Sudan People's Liberation Movement (SPLM) regime to voice its views and opinions.

Does communication infra structure affect economic growth in South Sudan?

Communication infra structure significantly impacted Pakistan's economic prosperity and the same could be applied to South Sudan. Olaseni and Alade (2012) explained that infrastructure was strongly linked to economic growth. infrastructure capital investment as the main proxies used in the empirical evidence.

Is South Sudan lagging behind in telecommunications development?

Compared to the United States, South Sudan is massively lagging behind in the development of telecommunications. Under the country code +211, there were a total of 6.17 million connections in 2023. Among them were 6.17 million mobile phones, which corresponds to an average of 0.54 per person. In the US, this figure is 1.2 mobile phones per person.
