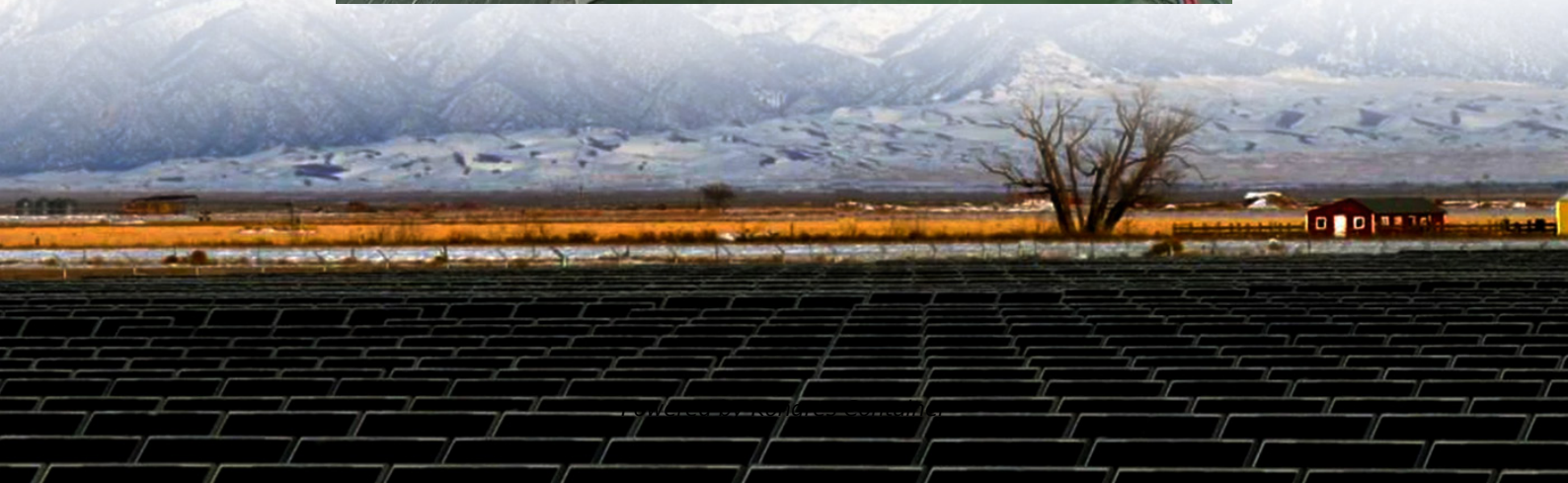

The reason why Sao Tome and Principe does not use base stations for communication



Overview

Does Sao Tome and Principe have a good internet connection?

Sao Tome and Principe is lagging behind in the expansion of broadband internet connections. Around 62 percent of all residents have access to the internet. Around 3 percent have their own fast internet connection, which is at least faster than the former ISDN (more than 256 kbit/s).

What percentage of Sao Tome & Principe residents have broadband?

Values above 100 percent mean that, on average, every inhabitant has more than one connection. Sao Tome and Principe is lagging behind in the expansion of broadband internet connections. Around 62 percent of all residents have access to the internet.

Does so Tomé & Principe use satellite?

São Tomé and Principe relied on satellite for international Internet connectivity until the arrival of the ACE undersea fibre-optic cable in 2012. STP Cable was established as a public-private partnership to manage the country's holdings in ACE with the goal of open access and cost-based wholesale costs.

Does so Tomé & Principe have a microwave link?

A high-capacity microwave connection was deployed between the islands of São Tomé and Principe in 2015. The transmission link covers 176 km, one of the longest microwave routes in the world, and provides 300 Mbit/s of capacity, more than nine times the previous link.

How much does mobile telephony cost in Sao Tome & Principe?

If one does not take a fixed amount in US dollars, but converts it to the economic output per inhabitant, a user in Sao Tome and Principe spends 7.1% of his income on mobile telephony. Worldwide, this rate is around 5.3 percent. In the USA, the monthly cost was around \$49.10.

Why did USAGM stop a small wave station in Sao Tome?

The USAGM has just stopped its medium and short wave station on the island of Sao Tome. An unannounced stop, which the agency wanted discreet. The end of 34 years of history: The VOA was installed in Liberia, in 1990, the civil war made the station totally unusable. The United States wanted to find another site in the region.
